Why does parent education in autism matter in Croatia?

- Early intervention services
- not embedded in the system of support,
- mainly project based
- not available for all children
- Expensive organized through private sector, promoting one approach

- Support for families
- Not developed
- Focus is on improving skills of the child not empowering parents

Why does parent education in autism matter in Croatia?

- Lack of support groups for parents and families (siblings)
- Parents often rely on information from the internet and promises of the cure
- Professionals
- Some professionals still don't have enough knowledge about ASD
- Lack of professionals of education and rehabilitation profiles in distant areas

• Education can lead to empowering parents, increasing their confidence – they are the experts for their child



3 groups of parents attended "Positive approaches to Autism" education

Some feedback form parents from Croatia

- "I wish I had the opportunity to attend this education when my child was diagnosed with ASD"
